 - 4 - Kapule - below Kalona camp
 - 3 - Pali Poko - small gulch, (opihis little bit)
 - 5 - Kapaka - very good fishing, pihis & opihis
 - 6 - Maunaloa - best opihis spot & fishing
 - 7 - Nalepai - ^{plenty} only good for fishing and
 - 8 - Pali Poko - ^{very} good spot for "pihi"
 - 9 - Kamuali - very long about 4-5 mi long
 - 10 - Alai Kila - good fishing & opihis lots
 - 11 - Pali Poko - " " too short for opihis
 - 12 - Ka Maui " " and opihis

Old familiar sights & places now
gone -

- 1- old white stone bridge next to Mormon church - which was next to Wachi's place.
- 2- Mormon Church main
- 3- old gravity track & station next to M. church
- 4- " Mahoe's residence - once below Wachi's used to be our first Mormon church.

Note

Do you remember the Old Ditch which carried drinking water from Kohala to Paaulo -

a- all sugarcane below this ditch were flumed down to the railroad track and also hauled to the Mill by ~~truck~~.

b- cane above ditch were hauled by ^{train} wagons to gravity station next to Mormon Church - put in small cars to be hauled to mill

All this is finished ^{now} - all cane is loaded on to huge diesel trucks which roll directly to the mills -

However, on last report per 1985 - this has been done away too, and the

sugar cane fields have been
converted into macadamia nut
fields - so bye-bye sugar cane.
